Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vines; Though the produce of the olive fails and the fields yield no food; Though the flock is cut off from the fold and there is no herd in the stalls. Yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will exult in the God of my salvation. Habakkuk 3:17-18 NRSV.

My dear sisters and brothers in the coming Christ, I have loved the above verses from the days of my youth because of its ridiculous paradoxical Thanksgiving. It sounded outrageously ironic when I read it for the first time. How could it be possible for anybody on earth to be that joyful and thankful in such an extreme life situation as this?

In our nation's history, we also face this sort of Thanksgiving in Abraham Lincoln, the 16<sup>th</sup> President. President Lincoln, at the height of the Civil War, proclaimed such an ironic and paradoxical Thanksgiving in his Proclamation of Thanksgiving: "The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the Source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful Providence of Almighty God. ..." [Abraham Lincoln. Proclamation of Thanksgiving, Oct. 3, 1863]

For me, Lincoln's Thanksgiving is truly an authentic and paradoxical confirmation of the identity of the Americans as the people of God in a sense that it came out in the deep midst of the Civil War which was our Nation's chaotic moment of physical and spiritual brokenness between the South and North.

life of Thanksgiving is the Our verv paramount act of proclamation of our identity, dignity and value as the people of God made in his image and likeness. Our Scriptures likely clarifies such high identity and value of ours as this: "The Word became flesh and lived among us" - This is who we are and this who our God is! This is the very ground of our life filled up with the Spirit of Thanksgiving. God has already come to us and been dwelling in the midst of us in Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior! This is why we are called out to shout out, "Happy Thanksgiving" and "Merry Christmas!" God is with us and we give our deepest Thanks to our God, the Author of our Life here and now and beyond.

May the Lord's never-failing and neverending grace and blessings be upon each and every single one of you throughout these blessed seasons of Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas.



# **Training Opportunity -**

## Our next Safe Sanctuaries and Sexual Harassment training will be April 21, 2020

Delaware Headwaters Parish believes that scripture instructs us to care for the children and adults brought into the church. We are committed to their protection, and in doing so to represent God's justice and mercy in the world.

Our goal is to protect our children, youth and vulnerable adults, protect

our volunteers and staff and safeguard our resources for mission and ministry.

We will offer Safe Sanctuaries and Sexual Harassment training on April 21, 2020 from 6-8pm at Hobart UMC for all employees and volunteers.

Safe Sanctuaries® is the name commonly given by United Methodist Annual Conferences and local churches to their individual efforts to make church programs welcoming and safe for children, youth and vulnerable adults and the adults who work with them. Training is mandatory for all employees and volunteers.

The United Methodist Church is committed to preventing misconduct and addressing it when it occurs. Even if you have not been directly affected by sexual misconduct, every member of every congregation must get involved to eradicate sexual harassment and misconduct in The United Methodist Each of us needs to know Church what constitutes sexual misconduct and how prevalent the problem is.

All New York State employers must provide employees with sexual harassment prevention training upon hire and on an annual basis. It is the opinion of our UMC leaders that all church volunteers have this training also.

One of the favorite items we provide is disposable diapers for our babies and children. The diapers are






purchased with our mission offering for Blissful Baby Bottoms. Anyone can donate diapers or coupons for diapers.

We want to give you some highlights from the last two months and look ahead for you to know how to better pray for us.

### Speaking

Alain has stepped in to help cover preaching at our Home church while our pastor is on sabbatical September-October. It has been great to teach through the Word in Psalm 119 to people we love. Our church is small and out in the country, yet it cares deeply about missions throughout the world **School** 

The kids are doing well in school at home: Camille in 5<sup>th</sup> grade and Caleb in Kindergarten (and Mia-Joy in potty training:>). Alain is finishing up his last two prerequisite science courses.

Applications are in to physician assistant schools and we wait to see whether God opens that door in the next year or so. We'll keep you posted on any progress.

### **Visiting Georgia**

We will be making a trip down to Rome, GA, in October. We will be sharing with friends at First Baptist in Rome on Oct 13th. Alain will only stay a few days because he has to get back to classes, but Katherine and the kids will be staying in Rome for 2 weeks to soak up time with her grandmother and parents. Let us know if you would like to connect while we are in the South this month.

### **Togo Return**

As Alain completes his prerequisite studies and our furlough comes to an end, we are planning our return to Togo for the end of December. It's always a daunting task to wrap up life in one place and focus on transitioning to the next. Returning to Togo means focusing on speaking French with the kids, getting all our vaccinations, renewing passports and visas, juggling all the details of a move, and finishing well on this end. These transitions don't get easier with time. Even though we both grew up overseas and have gone back and forth living in the US and overseas our whole lives, each transition has new challenges to navigate -especially as our children are continually growing and too. These include changing the challenges always present of letting go of your stuff, packing the necessities, reprogramming your brain to live cross culturally, and mentally preparing for the heat and the challenges of Africa. But....these are times when we always God's faithfulness and experience provisions! We are excited to get back to serving in Togo and we are thankful that as we leave our friends here in the US, we return to dear friends in Togo whom we love –friends we minister with and friends we get to share God's love with.

### Our next phase of ministry

As we head back in December, we will be jumping back in to ministry at the Hospital of Hope. Our colleagues who oversee the chaplaincy outreach will be going on furlough and we will step in to cover for them and invest in our chaplains that we trained back in 2014. We are eager to step in and help our team at the hospital in many different capacities.

-For our team at the Hospital of Hope and the continued medical ministry.


